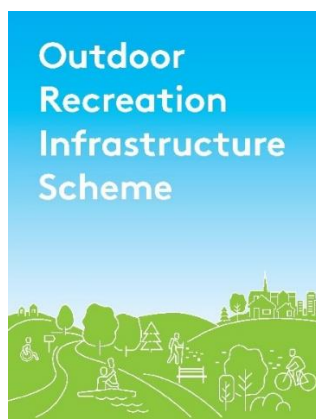
COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT SCHEMES **EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST**

Longford County Council invites Expressions of Interest from local communities who wish to be considered for participation in the Community Involvement Scheme.

The scheme provides for grant assistance which must be matched by a minimum 15% from the Community, for eligible works including general maintenance, drainage works, pavement works and footpaths.

"Minister O'Gorman invites applications to the Communities Integration Fund 2021

- €500,000 will be made available to local community-based projects nationwide to support the integration of migrants.
- Grants of up to €5,000 will be allocated to successful organisations to support integration initiatives.

The Minister for Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth, Roderic O'Gorman T.D., today announced €500,000 in funding under the Communities Integration Fund 2021.

Now in its fifth year, the Communities Integration Fund celebrates the rich cultural diversity within local communities and enables local community-based organisations across Ireland to play a greater role in supporting the integration of migrants. Eligible organisations can apply for grant funding of €1,000 – €5,000 to support local integration initiatives.

The closing date for receipt of applications is **6 pm on Friday 02 July 2021.**

The Migrant Integration Strategy sets out the Government's commitment to the promotion of migrant integration as a key part of Ireland's renewal and as an underpinning principle of Irish society. The Strategy provides a framework for a range of actions to support migrants to participate fully in Irish life.

The Communities Integration Fund arises from Action 51 of the Migrant Integration Strategy, which calls for funding to be made available to local communities throughout Ireland to promote the integration of migrants and refugees. Since its inception in 2017, the Communities Integration Fund has supported over 480 projects with grant funding totalling €2.26m.

Purpose of projects/activities

This call is open to local community based groups and centres around 10 key themes to support migrant integration:

- Intercultural Awareness;
- Combating Racism and Xenophobia;
- Sport & Community Games;
- Arts;
- Food/Cuisine;
- Community Events;
- Capacity Building;
- Employment;
- Education;
- Integration Research.

As this Fund is intended to support the integration of migrant and host communities, all applications must demonstrate the ability to involve both migrant and host communities in the activities proposed. The maximum grant amount that can be applied for is €5,000 and the minimum grant is €1,000.

Our Rural Future: Ministers Humphreys, McConalogue and Hackett announce final call for applications to the LEADER Food Initiative

€5 million fund aimed at artisan, micro and small food businesses

Funding will help artisan, micro and small food businesses to respond to challenges posed by Brexit and COVID-19

LEADER programme a key plank of ‘Our Rural Future’

Small food businesses are today (Tuesday, May 25th) being encouraged to apply for funding under the LEADER Food Initiative – a €5 million investment aimed at assisting businesses to deal with the challenges posed by Brexit and COVID-19.

The final call for applications was made by Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys, Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Charlie McConalogue and Minister of State for Land Use and Biodiversity, Pippa Hackett.

The funding will help artisan, micro and small food businesses to respond to challenges posed by Brexit and COVID-19, while also supporting diversification in agriculture.

In December 2020, Ministers Humphreys, McConalogue and Hackett announced the extension of the LEADER Food Initiative into 2021.

As part of that announcement, the maximum rate of aid available to projects involving economic activity was increased from 50% to 75% for project applications received on or after 1st April 2021.

Announcing the final call for applications, all three Ministers urged small food businesses to submit their applications.

The Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys T.D., has today (9th April 2021) announced the details of the allocation of the €70 million **Transitional LEADER programme** for the period 2021-2022.

- €65 million is being allocated to support locally-led rural development projects across the 29 Local Action Groups (LAGs)
- €3 million is being allocated to support the LEADER Cooperation measure which encourages rural areas to work together on collaborative projects
- €2 million will be allocated to prepare for the next LEADER Programme

Minister Humphreys has also today published the funding allocations being provided to each of the 29 Local Action Groups (LAGs).

The SDG Roadshow is a cross country cycle being undertaken by Drogheda based NGO Development Perspectives and SAOLTA in a bid to raise awareness of the Global Goals, and in this instance, a more sustainable mode of travel, the trusty bicycle.



The tour will consist of two team members, CEO Bobby McCormack, and Project Officer Nick Doran, setting off from opposite sides of the country, visiting towns and communities along the way while highlighting the importance and relevance of the Global Goals to localities around Ireland.

We are delighted to collaborate with our friends at Development Perspectives, who have chosen Longford as one of their stop off points - offering a fab workshop on the Sustainable Development Goals to those wishing to participate.

The Sustainable Development Goals are a set of global commitments to end poverty, protect the planet and promote peace, justice, and equality by 2030.

Ireland played a unique and central role in the process which led to the agreement of these 17 Global Goals which were signed up to by 193 UN member states. Along with these member states were over 8 million NGOs, civil society organisations and the private sector organisations who helped develop, and subscribed to these ambitious targets.

This takes us to the Bike Tour: Development Perspectives believes that for these goals to be successful the public need to be aware of, and crucially involved and active in, realising them.

Throughout the bike tour a series of outdoor trainings will be delivered, introducing the Global Goals to communities at each stop. These workshops will be based around participatory, experiential learning methods and will explore the relevance of the Goals to local communities, explain why they are important, and what their impact is, both locally and globally.

DP CEO Bobby McCormack will set off from County Louth with a cargo bike full of exciting workshop resources and visit towns across the East coast. At the same time, Project Officer, Nick Doran will set off from Co Sligo and tour the West Coast. Throughout the Road Show, the intrepid SDG cyclists will deliver workshops in towns such as Longford, Navan, Athenry, and Tullamore, while coming together mid-way in

New Irish Language Learning Resources in the Library

A new selection of Irish books specifically written for adult learners of Irish have recently been purchased by the library. These books are suitable for those who have reached the stage where they are happy to work on their own with the language without the aid of a teacher. The selection includes short stories, novels and some non-fiction books covering topics such as homelessness, alcoholism, grief, family relationships and murder mysteries. The chapters are short and difficult words are explained at the bottom of each page. The

clear accessible style enables the adult learner to easily follow the story while also assimilating new words and phrases. I am attaching images of some of the covers of these books as well as a review of one of the books.

Other resources in the library for adult learners of Irish include grammar books such as “Gramadach Gan Stró” which provides answers to all the grammatical exercises in the book. There are also multimedia course books such as “Turas Teanga” and “Gaeilge Gan Stró” for beginners and lower intermediate levels. In addition, adult learners may access the free Irish language course which is available on the library web page. Clicking on “Online Library and Electronic Resources” followed by “Language Courses” gives the adult learner access to interactive and engaging courses in over 120 different languages including Irish. These courses are suitable for beginners and lower intermediate levels.

Eligibility for ECCE

The Early Childhood Care and Education Programme (ECCE) programme is a universal two-year pre-school programme available to all children within the eligible age range.

The programme is provided for three hours per day, five days per week over 38 weeks per year and the programme year runs from September to June each year.

There is one point of entry at the beginning of the programme year. The programme will be available to all children who have turned 2 years and 8 months of age before September 1st as long they won't turn 5 years and 6 months of age on or before June 30th of the programme year.

One Future is a network of campaign groups across Ireland who advocate for faster and fairer climate action within their constituencies and communities by building local campaigns and lobbying local TDs.

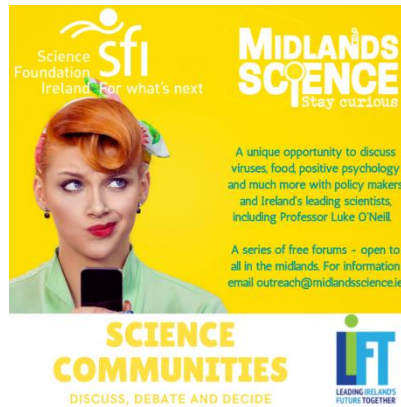

Midlands Science is running this year called Science Communities. This project, which is an SFI Discover Project, aims to create dialogue and discussion between members of the community in the midlands and those involved in science and public policy. We will have Professor Luke O'Neill from Trinity College Dublin and Professor Ciaran O'Boyle (RCSI) alongside other experts from UCD, RCSI and more attending these events.

We are looking for members of the public to get involved. You do not need to have a science background or have any interaction with STEM in your day-to-day life to take part. We are looking for a broad range of people from across the midlands, we are particularly interested in engaging people who would not usually interact with science or STEM in their everyday lives. The participants in this project will be invited to attend four public forums (online). These forums will run during August, September, October and November (one per month) and will cover a range of topics such as: understanding science and evidence, food and alcohol, health, medicines, viruses and vaccines.

Participants will also be offered the chance to attend a LIFT facilitation training day free of charge. LIFT is a not-for-profit organisation which aims to increase the level of positive leadership in Ireland. This facilitation training should be beneficial to participants, not just during the actual forum, but also in their everyday lives.

PPN Structural Review Survey

The Department of Rural and Community Development (DRCD) are interested in getting your views on Public Participation Networks (PPNs).

Our Rural Future: Minister Humphreys launches public consultation on the first ever National Outdoor Recreation Strategy

- **New strategy to shape the development of outdoor pursuits and activity tourism for years to come**
- **Public asked for feedback on how to enhance amenities such as trails, cycleways, waterways, beaches, mountains, bogs and forests**
- **Delivery of new strategy a key commitment in ‘Our Rural Future’**

Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys, has today (Wednesday, 2nd June, 2021) launched a public consultation on Ireland’s first ever National Outdoor Recreation Strategy.

The delivery of the strategy is a key commitment in Our Rural Future, the Government’s ambitious five-year policy to revitalise Rural Ireland.

The consultation will last for three weeks and will involve members of the public giving their views on how best to improve and develop our outdoor amenities such as our trails, cycleways, waterways, beaches, mountains, bogs and forests.

The public are also being asked to consider ways to develop activity tourism and outdoor pursuits such as cycling, rock climbing, kayaking, surfing, wind-surfing, sailing, paragliding and hang-gliding.

The consultation will run for the next three weeks with the closing set scheduled for 5pm on 23 June, 2021.

The strategy is being developed in partnership with Comhairle na Tuaithe (The Countryside Council).

This is the first stage of a two-stage consultation process. In the first stage, interested stakeholders and individuals are encouraged to share their views on outdoor recreation via an online questionnaire.

Responses will inform the preparation of the National Outdoor Recreation Strategy for Ireland. The closing date for receipt of submissions is 5pm on 23 June, 2021.



Telling stories across Europe of the creativity of Irish rural and community development

Search opens for pioneering projects that improve the lives of people and communities for entry to fifth Europe-wide Political Awards

A jury of 1,000 European citizens will single out the year's most innovative projects. Submissions are open now. The search is on for the most innovative projects in Ireland for entry to the prestigious Innovation in Politics European Awards which are heading into their fifth instalment. Politicians and public authorities from Ireland and all over Europe are being invited to submit their most outstanding initiatives.

A jury of 1,000 citizens will then select the winning projects in nine categories. The winners will receive one of the coveted trophies at a special awards ceremony in December. Held since 2017, 24 Irish projects and politicians have been finalists in these European Awards that put creative politicians and decision-making centre stage, with the aim of motivating people to emulate them. European citizens can now nominate projects in nine different categories, or alternatively politicians can submit their own projects.

The categories are: Community, Democracy, Digitalisation, Ecology, Economy, Education, Human Rights, Quality of Life and Covid-19 strategies.

All submissions will be assessed by a Europe-wide citizens' jury. In each category, the 10 projects with the highest jury ratings will be the finalists. The nine winners will be announced at a ceremony in December.
