Ballyminion Masterplan

Longford County Council are preparing a Masterplan for the Ballyminion Area. This first step in the process is to hear your opinion - what you think would make this a better place to live, work or invest?

Ballyminion is one of eight areas within Longford town that were identified as part of the Town Plan that, if developed in the right way, would have an important positive impact on the town as a whole. The input of those who live in the area is the starting point in creating a vision for the future that the plan can achieve through dedicated projects to secure the required funding.



There are plans in place that deal with the development of the Country, the Country and the Town. These set rules for how areas are developed to make sure that the services are in place to allow this development while protecting residential amenity, environmental quality, value for money and promoting the economy.



These plans have been made at different levels, national, regional, county and town, to make sure that they fit together, so as the areas that each plan covers gets smaller, more details are needed on things like - will development in this area affect national traffic movements? How much development is suitable and what type? How can development be energy efficient and reduce the need to travel?

The aim of this Masterplan is to promote the right development in the right places and to make sure that the communities in the area benefit from available funding streams to get the services and amenities that they need for a high quality of life.

This is the first step in starting the conversation on the development of the area. All your responses will be taken into consideration in putting together a draft document that will then be used for further discussion. Longford County Council will hold a series of meetings with the community for this purpose over the coming months.
